How to Form and Fund a New York Not-for-Profit Corporation

This evening's program will offer practical advice on the steps to be taken to form a New York not-for-profit corporation; to obtain tax-exempt status for such charitable corporation; and to fulfill Federal and New York State registration, reporting and tax filing requirements. The differences between public charities and private foundations will be discussed, as well as the problems faced by certain small charities which are funded primarily by their founders.

The last hour of the program will provide information about fund-raising for the charity once it is created. Donor cultivation, special events planning and implementation of a planned giving program will be among the fund-raising methods discussed. There will be a special emphasis on fund-raising ideas for charities that benefit animals.
